Project Risk Analysis for Project Managers – April 28

Are you able to answer the following questions for each of your firm's projects?

- What are your project risks?
- Who is responsible for those risks?
- What are the warning indicators?
- What is the likelihood that an event will occur?
- What is the potential magnitude for each risk?
- What are the key assumptions that drive the risk event?
- What is the best strategy for managing the risk?
