## Coba’s Capitol Comments

The work session on **SB 213**, duty to defend, will be delayed a week until April 8 as conversations about a path forward continue. The deadline to move the bill from the Senate Judiciary Committee is April 13 and it is expected we will meet this deadline. Once SB 213 is voted out of the Senate Judiciary Committee we will need ACEC members involvement to assist in moving it across the Senate floor and into the House.

Another COVID-19 case in the House delayed floor sessions this week and Republicans continue to require that each word in every bill is read on the floor before votes can be taken. This procedural move is intended to slow the session and allow House Republicans opportunities to have input on legislation.
